Ayla Spry

Ayla Spry is a WAHA Youth Member and 2011 winner of two prestigious USEF awards:
The 2011 USEF High School Equestrian Athlete Grant and
The USEF Youth Sportsman's AERC nomination award

Ayla's Story: Submitted by Rachel (Ayla's mother):



Sometimes, to accomplish our goals, we have to think outside the box. Even

Ayla Spry of Milaca, MN does just that. Her steps lead her to the barn. Because of this, she is well on her way to attaining her goals at just age 16. This year Ayla was chosen by USEF (the governing board for the US Equestrian Olympics) as a recipient of the 2011 USEF High School Equestrian Athlete grant. The grant awarded her was for \$1,000 towards future academic or equestrian educational pursuits. In Ayla's case, they are combined. She was chosen best overall from AERC essay submissions. And if that wasn't wonderful enough, Ayla also received another award. to step outside the box.

This award, the USEF Youth Sportsman's AERC nomination award, was chosen on her leadership and sportsmanship qualities. Ayla will be honored at the USEF Annual Convention meeting in Ohio. The award grants her airfare, hotel, meals and \$500.00 in grant money to use for educational pursuits. One of those educational pursuits will take place this week [first week in December 2011], in Scottsdale, AZ. The grant is paying for Ayla to attend the AHA Judges school. Ayla is the youngest participant ever to be accepted to the school, with the next youngest participant being 21. Ayla has also been chosen by the USEF marketing department (who was contacted by a TV producer) that is working on a video featuring equestrian youth that compete, to represent USEF, AERC National winners in the equestrian TV show. In mid November, Ayla was also awarded the Tri-State Laura Sedgwick award.

In August, Ayla took two National TT Titles at the Canadian Arabian Horse Nationals in Sport horse Under Saddle and Arabian Native Costume. In July, she took the Regional title in Endurance riding. In August, she was employed by Cavalia, in their promotional department.

What led her to these awards is her dedication to horses, their care, and sharing her love and knowledge with others. Living just outside of Milaca, on a farm, where she manages the barn (33 stalls, indoor riding arena with rubber flooring, heated feed and office area) keeps Ayla busy when not preparing one of her horses for competition. Ayla teaches local youth horse care and gives riding instruction. Additionally she is very active in horse rescue. Just recently she rescued a 38 year old Arab gelding, Lazon, that had a "1" body score, and now after just 2 months he is up to a "4" and getting sassy! Lazon loves the round the clock meals provided (rescue horses need feeding every 2 hours) and his oversize stall (18 x20) bedded deep for his old body, and recently his comfy new blanket. Working with Anoka Equine Vet and Lucky 7 Farrier (the very best around!) Ayla has rescued and rehabilitated many horses and other animals in need as well.



Dancing to the beat of a different drummer (horse dancing-also termed Dressage) Ayla has had many incredible opportunities presented to her, that she has been able to accept and learn from. Ayla spent the summer being mentored by Jan Worthington, a member of the WEG (World Equestrian Games)
